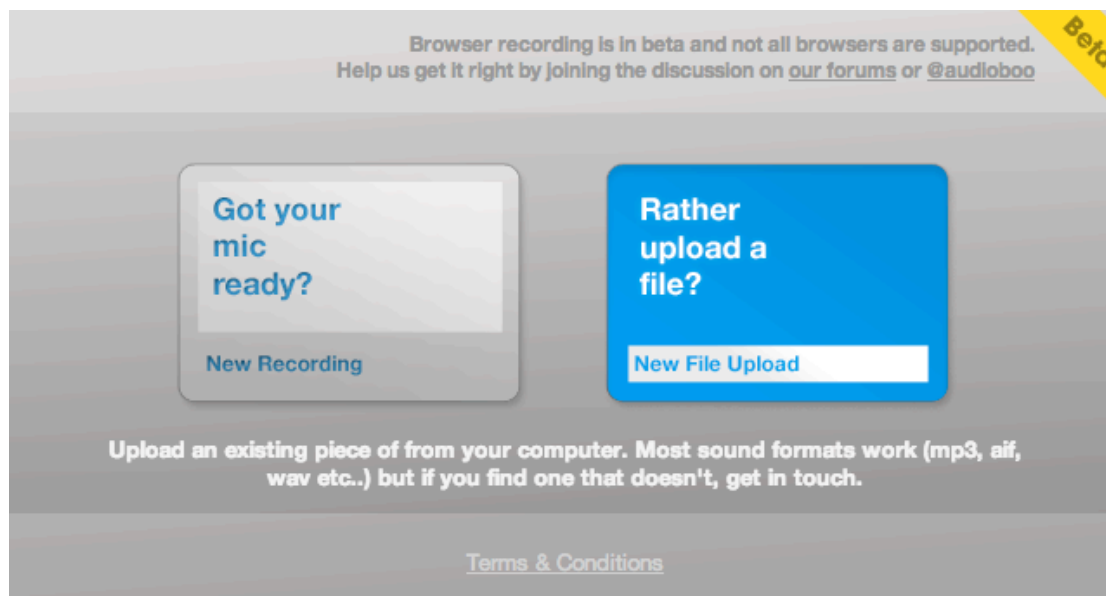

TO UPLOAD SOUNDS YOU HAVE EDITED ON YOUR COMPUTER:

1 – Go to Audioboo website <http://audioboo.fm/>

If you haven't already got an account – sign up for one!
Otherwise... Log in.

2 – Select “Record / upload Boo “

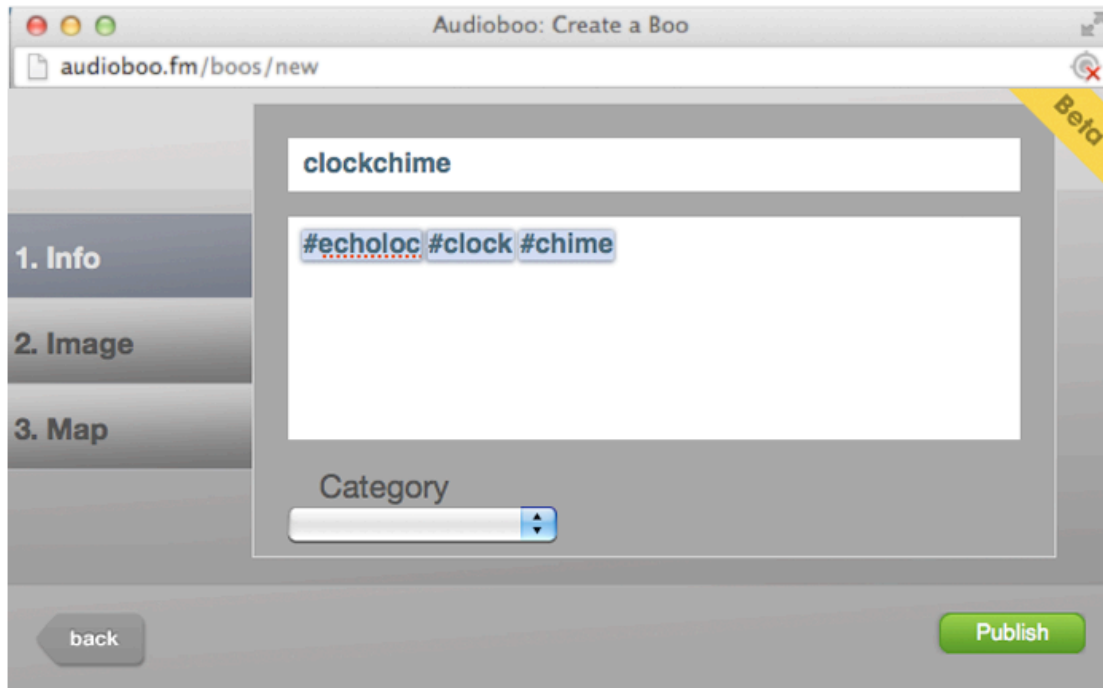


The next window asks you to select your edited file

3 – Add information – IMPORTANT –

It has to be tagged **#echoloc** so it appears on the Echo Location soundmap

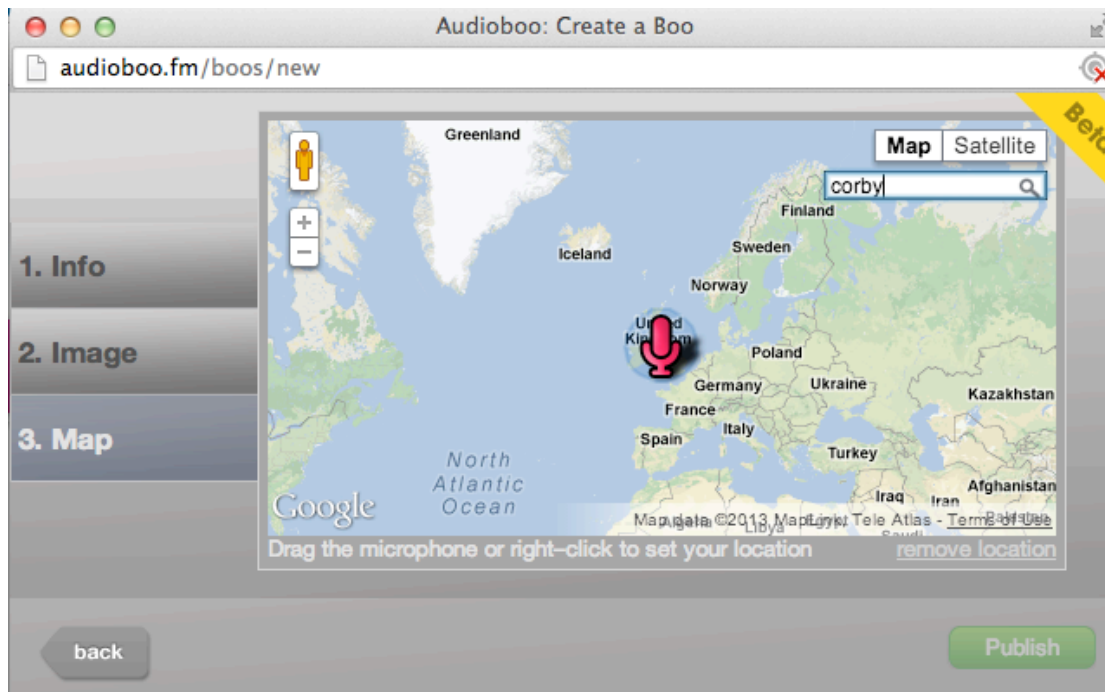
You can add other tags - these will add to the tag cloud... be selective, not too many tags please!! Have a look at the existing tag cloud and try and choose existing tags if there are any that are appropriate... this makes it more interesting to combine closely related recordings.



IMPORTANT

You have to select the place it was recorded in the 'MAP' section.

To save having to zoom all the way in, type in a place close by and use the search tool. Then you can use the zoom in and out tools to find the right spot. Try to be as pin point accurate as possible!



THEN CLICK PUBLISH...

Your sounds should appear on the map automatically... but it may not be immediately... keep checking! - It can sometimes just be a few minutes.

UPLOAD TO AUDIOBOO USING YOUR SMARTPHONE

If you have a smartphone, then you can download the free Audioboo app to your phone

Using this, you can record sounds directly using your mobile phone, and upload them onto the map – as long as you tag them #echoloc...

If you have location finding switched on, then it will automatically know where you recorded it and put it on the map in the right place

This is really convenient, and you can add to the Echo Location map whenever you hear an interesting sound you want to record.

The only disadvantage is that you can't listen on headphones when recording, and can't edit the sounds to pick the best bit.

If you use Audioboo to directly upload – then please only record short samples – because this does work better for the interactive map playback controls.
